

ACHIEVE Program of Study Overview/Comprehensive Transition Certificate

To earn the ACHIEVE Comprehensive Transition Certificate, students must complete at least 36 credits, participate in at least 18 credits of campus activities, complete at least two community-based internships (12 credits), create and present a capstone portfolio (6 credits), and meet the learning outcomes described below.

All ACHIEVE students are assigned an Intensive Academic Advisor and Employment Consultant who work with the student to draft and implement a comprehensive, individual program of study. Specific courses and activities are determined based on skills and competencies needed for the student to achieve his or her identified employment goal(s).
